
in confiscating 157425.87 grams of marijuana, or 347.064 pounds, 39.44 grams of methamphetamine or 1.39 ounces, 1 gram cocaine, 58 hydrocodone tablets, a 9mm handgun, \$11,819.00 cash and \$27,922.00 in U.S. Treasury checks. Trooper Amundson was able to remove well over 1 million dollars worth of illegal drugs destined to be distributed in the United States. Trooper Amundson has also been involved in numerous other successful drug interdiction efforts in southwestern Montana. These nine significant seizures indicate the thoroughness of Trooper Amundson's work product, as well as the team work philosophy. Additionally, he had forty eight misdemeanor drug arrests throughout the 2009 year.

The felony arrests were turned over to the Missouri River Drug Task Force, DEA and ICE for further investigation. He also broke up a check cashing ring from a traffic stop. The individuals were from California and had been cashing checks all over the country. The individuals had over 30 different sources of fraudulent identification cards. The case was turned over to the FBI and ICE.

Trooper Amundson's participation is a key component for the Montana

Highway Patrol as a member of the Rocky Mountain Highway Patrol Criminal Interdiction Team. This team concept of drug interdiction is exemplified by Trooper Amundson working closely with other agencies to stem the flow of dangerous drugs and identify other illegal acts. He is a model trooper and has a skill set that consistently has led to apprehending fugitives, recovering stolen vehicles, confiscating illegal drugs and weapons, cooperating with all enforcement task forces, and sharing intelligence with partner law enforcement agencies at the national, state, and local levels.

For these reasons, Trooper Amundson was selected as the Montana Narcotics Officer of the Year for 2009, and he received this recognition at a banquet held in Bozeman on March 11, 2010. Congratulations Trooper Amundson!




